




ANNUAL REPORT 2024 SPECIAL INTEREST MUSIC CENTRE

We were incredibly fortunate to once again be invited to participate in the 'Baroque Academy', collaborating with Marryatville High School and the Elder Conservatorium of Music under the guidance of some of Australia's finest Baroque musicians.

Open piano concerts continued to provide invaluable performance opportunities for students, including our 2 merit-achieving year 12s, and enabled families to connect with the school and music program. Our first 'Sunset Serenade' replaced the term 4 'Jazz in the Quad', allowing our jazz ensembles to reaudition and begin preparations for Generations in Jazz. The re-imagined event provided the opportunity for more ensembles, directors and families to experience this relaxed, evening, openair concert format.

The Music Captains made a significant contribution to the culture of the music program, especially in relation to all aspects of Music Spectacular, themed 'Out of this World' in 2024.

The Sensational Strings Primary Schools Workshop provided encouraging signs for the future with participation increasing from 60 in 2023 to 100. 7 Core Music numbers increased markedly to 75 with the change from being a full-year subject to a single semester, allowing students more subject choices. Additionally, the remaining 225 year 7s studied 1 term of Music Experience, signifying a return to the days when all students studied music in their first year of high school.

Meetings between the Heads and Coordinators from the Special Interest Music Centres returned to pre-COVID regularity with one of the actions being a combined presence in the foyer of the Primary Schools Music Festival.

A lunchtime concert series showcasing the jazz combo, both big bands and jazz choirs supported a more thorough preparation for Generations in Jazz while creating a festive atmosphere in the quad appreciated by the school community. With 3rd place being awarded to Big Band 2, Jazz Choir 1 and Jazz Choir 2, this was arguably our most successful campaign. Additionally, when combined with outstanding results at the Adelaide Choral Eisteddfod, our choirs had placed in every competition entered in 2024.

The Concert Band returned to the advanced section of the ABODA Band and Orchestra Festival achieving gold, while the Brighton Chamber Orchestra was awarded gold in the advanced strings section, repeating their effort from 2023.

The contribution of the Music Parent Support Group and the Brighton Sunday Market team added significantly to the affordability and equity of many of the amazing opportunities on offer.

Regional Tour

The tour was a great opportunity for members of orchestra who haven't yet had a chance to go on a school tour like Generations in Jazz.

We stayed at an accommodation in Wallaroo ran by Derek and Nicole, who made the "best camp food in Australia" (can confirm it's true) and were very hospitable. On Monday we went to the beach and later mini golf, where we played till sundown. The next day we went lawn bowling, and then it was Anti-Talent Night. There were several acts, including balancing a broom on a chin and eating a double serve of sticky date pudding in under 2 minutes. Some were more anti-talented than others, and the "dancing" Three Blue Worms took first place with a tie for second, but after an emotional and energetic Bohemian Rhapsody showdown the Not-So-Silent Night took home second in the end. Over the 3 days, we performed at Harvest Christian College on Monday, Wallaroo Mines Primary School and Ardrossan Area School on Tuesday, and Central Yorke School (which we got a tour of) and Wallaroo Primary on Wednesday. It was fun to perform for the students and listen to the skits written by the year 11s. It was an overall great experience to tour the countryside and perform for the students. We made a lot of fun memories along the way, and everyone worked hard to get all the repertoire together and it paid off.

MUSIC CAPTAINS' REPORT

2024 saw a very successful year for the music centre with both competition and performance opportunities as well as the growth of student connectedness across year levels.

The student leadership forum taking place at the beginning and middle of the year allowed the music captain team to work together and discuss what ideas we had for the year and what we hoped to achieve.

Brighton's efforts in Mount Gambier's Generations in Jazz festival did not go unnoticed. All our jazz ensembles performed exceptionally with Jazz Choirs 1 & 2 and Big Band 2 placing third in their divisions. This incredible opportunity also saw fabulous nighttime concerts by the Hot Potato Band, Coco's Lunch and Sai Brothers, Kate Ceberano and Budjerah, some inspiring artists. The exciting weekend brought students from all over Australia together to immerse themselves in jazz. This was also a great opportunity to grow the connectedness between students in all year levels.

The Piano Concert Series, formed in 2023, took place again this year. These free, relaxed concerts allowed pianists including students, staff, and old scholars to showcase their talent. Additionally, this year saw one Jazz in the Quad performance as well as the Winter Choral Concert, supporting students to prepare for their participation in the Adelaide Choral Eisteddfod, another successful event. Each choir placed in their divisions with Treble Choir in third, Bel Canto in second and Brightones in first place.

Our largest performance, Music Spectacular went above and beyond this year with the theme "Out of this World". The planning put into the concert were amazing joint efforts by the music captain team, music staff and especially Alevia and Mr Barrett. STAGE 2 Analysis:

In 2024 our results in the 2 practical subjects results were pleasing with many students achieving in the A band (75% for Solo and 71% for Ensemble), along with 3 students achieving an A+ grade and 2 merits for Solo Performance.

In Music Studies, 63% of students achieved in the A band compared with 57% in 2023 and 30% in 2022.

We also achieved an A+ in Music Explorations

In total there were 48 enrolled in the 4 Stage 2 Music subjects, 70% of students achieved in the A band, and 16% in the B band.
